General Session 1: **GASB** Update

Kenneth Schermann, GASB

Learn about the GASB pronouncements that have recently become effective and those that soon will be effective. A significant portion of the session focuses on the new pension standards. Particpants will also learn how to distinguish a merger from an acquisition and how the financial reporting entity has changed with the implementation of Statement 61.

General Session 2: Actuaries Talk GASB 68
